Conference Background

In recent years, Indian fisheries have experienced a significant transition from marine-based activities to a greater emphasis on inland fisheries. However, the sector faces numerous challenges, including climate change, pollution, water abstraction, biodiversity loss, overfishing, and unregulated aquaculture expansion. The sustainable management and conservation of aquatic resources have become pressing priorities. Emerging technologies, scientific innovations, and integrated policy frameworks are crucial to achieving long-term sustainability in this sector. Strengthening capacity building, ensuring stakeholder participation, and promoting climate-resilient practices will be essential to realizing the vision of a Blue Transformation. In this context, the seminar aims to deliberate on 'Envisaging Blue Transformation in Indian Fisheries and Aquaculture,' focusing on strategies for a sustainable and resilient future.

Please give asterisk (*) for the name of presenting author (Name in Bold). Abstract should be followed by 4-5 keywords relevant to the research work mentioned in abstract. Authors must mention the theme under which they are submitting the abstract. For preventing discrepancies in page layout, the document file should be in word 97-2003 file format. All abstracts are to be submitted via official mail id (fisheriesoutlook2@gmail.com) on or before 15th June, 2025
